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PECO Restores Service to More Than 99% of Customers Impacted By Sandy

Working around-the-clock for a week straight, more than 4,700 PECO employees, contractors and workers from utilities around the country have restored electric service to 99 percent of the 850,000 PECO customers impacted by Hurricane Sandy. Crews from Florida, Tennessee, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Maryland, and PECO's Chicago-and Baltimore-based sister utilities BGE and ComEd are working along-side PECO employees until every customer is restored.

BGE sends employees out of state to help with outage work

Baltimore Gas and Electric Co., which fixed the last of its Cyclone Sandy power outages Friday, sent workers to harder-hit regions over the weekend and on Monday. BGE said 64 overhead linemen, safety and support workers are in the Philadelphia area, helping PECO. Both utilities are owned by Exelon Corp. A dozen BGE natural-gas mechanics and technicians, meanwhile, left Monday to aid New Jersey Natural Gas, which shut off service to part of the state last week because the system had been so badly damaged.

400 Ontario Utility Workers Travel to U.S.

Northeast to Assist with Power Restoration

Efforts in Aftermath of Hurricane Sandy

Crews and equipment arrive in the U.S. Northeast over the weekend; still more than 1.8 million without power one week after storm causes biggest power outage in U.S. history. Approximately 400 electricity distribution workers from 25 Ontario utilities have travelled in convoys of vehicles numbering more than 175 to Long Island, New York and other Northeastern states to restore power to communities devastated by Hurricane Sandy.

Around-the-Clock Restoration Efforts Continue for FirstEnergy Customers Affected by Hurricane Sandy

As part of a massive, around-the-clock effort, more than 19,000 professionals, including employees from Jersey Central Power & Light (JCP&L), Metropolitan Edison (Met-Ed), Mon Power, The Illuminating Company (CEI), Potomac Edison and other FirstEnergy (NYSE: FE) utilities, and outside contractors and utility workers, continue to restore service to customers who lost power following devastating Hurricane Sandy last week. The storm left more than 2.3 million FirstEnergy utility customers without power in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio and Maryland.
